

In America, lobby groups, corporations and billionaires invest millions of dollars to ensure that the 'right' candidate wins elections. It affects everything from the selection of local officials to presidential elections and creates countless conflicts of interest, undermining what used to be a model democracy. And it has a serious impact on people's daily lives. Drug prices are the highest in the world. Tax rates for the wealthy have fallen. Climate change is being denied. The impunity and extent of this is staggering. For many, this is nothing less than "legal corruption".

Today, America "is just an oligarchy with unlimited political bribery", said former president Jimmy Carter himself. Rules seem to have been designed to be bypassed, supposedly impartial judges are elected with the help of hundreds of thousands, if not millions of dollars. We follow candidates on the field during the electoral process and hear from people whose lives have been directly affected.



Creating a dress for ten euros in Europe, in less than a fortnight. It's not only possible, but it's becoming the norm. Since the fashion industry went down the path of fast-fashion, it's always both faster and cheaper - no matter the consequences.

Let's start with those suffering the most: the workers. They work between 12 and 15 hours a day for salaries less than half the legal minimum wage. And in abominable working conditions. Chemical products in textile factories often poison the workers and local residents.


According to the brands, they no longer have time to create. In order to satisfy an insatiable consumer appetite, copying the competition's creations makes things go faster and cheaper - even if it means risking a court case now and then...



Time is Money. In high frequency trading the fastest data network makes the deal. Computers trade against computers solely committed to the logic of their algorithms. Essentially, they are warring bots – money bots.

In the beginning, the idea was to use greater predictability and faster infrastructure to increase the stability of financial markets. But the opposite has occurred: automation has made them more vulnerable. Moneybots love instability, where the greatest profits are to be made, and high-frequency trading is damaging the real economy.

And, as with all electronic systems, the moneybots can be hacked. Already there have been cases of flash crashes that destabilised the world's markets. How did it come to this? We go back to their roots in the casinos of Las Vegas, where young mathematicians created algorithms and the first wearable computer to outsmart the roulette....




The Agent Orange catastrophe did not end with the war in Vietnam. Today, all over the world, a primary component of that toxic herbicide controls weeds in farming, forestry, parks — even on children's playgrounds. The chemical wreaks havoc on the human genome, causing deformed births and deadly cancers.

After decades of struggle and tragic personal losses, two heroic women are leading a worldwide movement to end the plague and hold the manufacturers accountable. In France, Tran To Nga is suing the American chemical industry for poisoning her Vietnamese family. And in America, Carol Van Strum exposes the continuing use of toxic herbicides.

Incriminating documents disappear. Activists and their children are threatened and die. A helicopter technician secretly films the contamination of reservoirs, while a massive industrial cover-up continues....

In less than 15 years, a group of astronauts will make a trip into the unknown that will last for more than three years and pose enormous human and technical challenges. For many, the journey to mars will be the longest and most epic journey ever imaged. But is it really so?

In 1519, Magellan and Elcano set off on a journey that would end up circumnavigating the globe. It was a voyage that closed one chapter for mankind and opened another to the modern age. And, as this film will show, there are striking similarities between the two journeys. Different eras. The same adventure. Man and his will to discover new horizons.

The Longest Voyage is a voyage between science and history. A story from the present that will search through the past for the keys to the future. Mixing animation, interviews and graphics and from the award-winning team behind 30 Years of Darkness.

From Larry Nassar abusing girl gymnasts to the scandal at USA Swimming, many recent news stories have exposed the sexual abuse of minors in sport all over the world. They suggest an even broader phenomenon.

It's thought that between 10 and 15% of athletes have been victims of sexual abuse. The number of children who are victims is estimated to be in the hundreds of thousands, with abuse more likely to be covered-up at elite levels. Children who practice sports are twice as likely to experience sexual abuse or harassment than those who don't. The magnitude of this phenomenon probably exceeds the number of victims of pedophilia in the Catholic Church.

Based on an unprecedented investigation covering different sports in different countries over a period of several years, we reveal how the system often protects the abuser.




Since the 1990s, El Salvador has been torn apart by a violent gang war. This tiny state in Central America is one of the most dangerous countries in the world.

Members of MS-13 and Barrio 18 fight a bloody war for control of the neighbourhoods. Julio, one of the leaders of Barrio 18, opens up before the camera and lets us film the violent induction ceremony for a new member. Forensic pathologist, Riccardo, specializes in the toughest crime scenes. This morning, he is investigating three dismembered bodies that have just been found in a ravine. His colleague Israel Ticas, a forensic criminologist, is working on a politically sensitive mass grave where 26 bodies were buried some 15 years ago.

We also filmed inside the high security prison of San Francisco Gotera. There, 1,700 gang members are held in deplorable conditions. Sworn enemies of rival gangs must learn to cohabit in the same cells.



The Sinaloa cartel earns an estimated three to twelve billion dollars per year. It's a huge business, with more than 200,000 people in Sinaloa alone, working directly or indirectly for organized crime.

We gained exceptional access to several factions of this cartel. In a clandestine laboratory, the "cooks" showed us how drugs are manufactured and then concealed in vehicles to enter the United States. Hired killers, like El Guero, show us their daily life as a sicario. Before each new mission, he prays to the goddess of death. In the poor neighborhoods of Culiacan, women like Jamilet do everything possible to seduce a drug lord.


In the past 15 years in Mexico, the drug war has claimed the lives of more than 230,000 people. 2019 broke all records with 35,000 murders. More than 50,000 people have 'disappeared'. Isabel tries to find their bodies. She has just received the plan of a mass grave...



Colonel Gulmurod Khalimov, head of Tajikistan's elite Special Forces, was a man at the heart of the establishment. But in April 2015 he disappeared – only to reappear a few weeks later in an ISIS recruitment video calling on all Muslims in the former Soviet Union to come and join him. In the video, he criticised the corruption and incompetence of Tajikistan's leaders and promised to 'bring slaughter' to his former homeland.

Khalimov was the most prominent of the more than 2,000 Tajiks reported to have joined ISIS and his defection was unprecedented. His incredible story lifts the lid on Central Asia, a region in the throes of upheaval, and reveals the deep malaise pervading former Soviet societies. So what do young people looking for another life, and Khalimov, who could no longer bear the hypocrisy and corruption, have in common? A shared belief that ISIS is the best way to achieve an ideal of justice and purity.




Along with use of the internet, cases of child sex abuse have exploded in the last ten years. Certain forums, meant only for children, have become the hunting grounds for sexual predators. And now there's a new practice on the darknet: the "live stream".

Today, more than 80% of adolescents use social networks. While many suspects are unmasked and condemned thanks to the contents of their computers, closing the sites on which they exchange photos is much more difficult. In the UK, groups of vigilante paedophile hunters pose as children to trap predators.

To avoid detection, more and more pedophiles turn to the darknet. There, the latest trend is the "live stream". From behind their computer screen, paedophiles pay for child abuse that is carried out live on camera. Most of these remotely-financed rapes take place in South East Asia. We join the police in the Philippines on a raid to rescue one victim.

Pakistan, 'land of the Pure', remains a country of contradictions. We examine some of the undercurrents threatening its stability.

Up in the Himalayas, at an altitude of 6,000 meters, a bizarre sort of war is being waged. 1,000 Pakistani soldiers face off against 3,000 Indian ones for control of the Siachen Glacier. With 70% of both their populations dependent on this glacier for water, it's a key strategic asset. We join the Pakistani Special Forces on patrol.

Wedged between India to the East, Iran and Afghanistan to the West and China to the North, Pakistan has long served as a key ally for the Americans. But clerics like Mullah Abdul Aziz, who led a shootout against the army at a radical mosque, remain extremely popular. And the situation of Pakistan's two million Christians remains precarious. They live in fear of being accused of blasphemy.



In Russia and the former USSR, the extreme combat sport MMA has become a social phenomenon. More than a sport, MMA is a social elevator, a political tool and even an instrument of propaganda glorifying the Russian man: virile, invicible and ready to defend the fatherland.

Mixing politics and MMA is a specialty of this region. Ramzan Kadyrov, Chechnya's ultra-authoritarian leader, uses it as political weapon to enhance the region's image and his own reputation. He has developed his own professional league and built up a team of champions who fight under his colors.

In Russia, MMA can lead to anything, even political power. In Krasnogorsk, the town's Deputy Mayor, is something of a political anomaly. Jeff Monson is American, knows nothing about running a town, and doesn't speak a word of Russian. He is, however a former MMA star, and his path was smoothed by Vladimar Putin.




### BIKERS FOR TRUMP

With their big Harleys, bushy beards and jackets covered in slogans glorifying America, 'Bikers for Trump' have

become a political force to be reckoned with. Four years ago, no one took them seriously. Then they played a pivotal role in the 2016 election. In this new campaign, the president listens to them more than ever.

They describe themselves as patriotic bikers whose sole purpose is to help re-elect President Donald Trump and pro-Trump candidates. For founder, Chris Cox, the stakes have rarely been higher. Not only is he fronting the bikers' campaign, he is also running for congress himself. But his recent claims that the coronavirus was a plot by the left to damage Trump does not appear to have helped. We join Cox and other bikers, crisscrossing the country on the campaign trail, and profile an often misunderstood side of America.

## IBIZA: THE ISLAND OF TWO FACES

The small Balearic island of Ibiza attracts almost three million tourists every summer.

With its legendary nightlife and iconic DJs, it has the reputation as a kind of Disneyland for adults. But hardly anyone has seen all the different facets of this extraordinary island.

Far from the clubs, parties and tourists, there is a wilder and commercially unknown side of Ibiza. Deep within the natural world, the last remaining island rebels live in caves, hidden from the rest of the society. For them, the island has magical properties. Legend has it that the rock formation just of the coast of the island is one of the most powerful energetic centres in the universe.

#### LOS CABOS: TROUBLE IN PARADISE

The seaside resort of Cabo San Lucas, or simply, Cabo, has become a favourite vacation

spot for American multimillionaires..... and Mexican drug traffickers. Indeed Cabo is a strategic spot for the continent's cartels forming a bridge between place of production and the key American market. It regularly tops the list of the world's most dangerous cities.

We spent several weeks following some of the people drawn to Cabo. Here tourists relax and unwind without a care in the world. US millionaire, Bill, is an annual competitor in the world's most richest fishing tournament. Adrien and Alexander are fine wine connoisseurs. We also met members of a cartel, who act more discreetly than a few years ago. Though the murder toll has dropped, the number of mysterious disappearances has increased.

# THE MED.: THE REFUGEE RAVEYARD

Almost 300 miles separates Libya from Sicily. This 300mile stretch

is known as the refugee graveyard. But for many, a fate worse than drowning at sea is being locked up in one of Libya's numerous detention centres. There, there is a very high chance of being abused, tortured and raped.

We managed to get inside one of the most notorious centres in Zawiya. There, we witnessed firsthand the appalling conditions. We gained rare access. But there are those who try to help. Humanitarian organisations specialising in rescue aid have taken to the sea or the skies to patrol the area.



#### ARGENTINIA: MY BODY, THEIR CHOICE

Efforts to loosen the restrictive abortion law in Argentina may have failed but the country remains

firmly divided. In the blue corner, a traditional Catholic elite who see abortion as murder. In the green corner, a rising movement of women fighting for the right to safe and legal abortion. We followed key participants on both sides of the debate in the lead-up to the most important vote in Argentina's history: the decision on whether to legalise abortion.

Mariana Rodríguez Varela, known by her detractors as the Crazy Baby Lady, is the face of the Pro-Life campaign. With her army of plastic foetuses, she is passionately pro-life. But the stories of women who suffered illegal abortions in horrific conditions show the horrific reality behind the pro-life rhetoric.

#### BUREAU 39: KIM'S CASH MACHINE

How is it possible that North Korea finances a nuclear weapons programme large enough to

challenge the USA? The answer: Bureau 39, a legendary organization nestled deep inside the government apparatus. Its aim is to procure foreign exchange by any means possible to provide Kim Jong-un's regime with money.

Printing dollars, dealing drugs, smuggling arms, insurance fraud, human trafficking – nothing is too unscrupulous for the money makers.

Years of research have given us unique access to insiders. They reveal the most spectacular cases and breath-taking tricks of how North Korea has been circumventing UN sanctions to finance its nuclear arsenal for decades.

### CHAINED (AGORA II)


After the euro and the refugee crises, the outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic was the third crisis

in a row for the European continent.

'Chained' narrates the five-year story of three successive crises in Europe with Greece in its epicenter. The country suffered an unprecedented reduction of its GDP by 25% – equivalent to a war. It also witnessed the devastation of the welfare state, the dismantling of the public health system, and the rise of inequalities and fascism.

'Chained' is the cinematographic mosaic of a European dystopia, posing critical questions regarding the future of director Avgeropoulos' country, as well as Europe's.

#### CAMBODIA: THE FORGOTTEN TEMPLE

Deep in the jungle of Cambodia, far off beaten tourist trails, lies a jewel

from the Khmer period: the Banteay Chhmar temple. Half devoured by jungle plants and long forgotten by people, the 800-year-old temple has been forgotten by the world.

On their own initiative, the villagers of Banteay Chhmar are slowly restoring of thetemple. They dream of it becoming a destination for travellers who want to get to know the real Cambodia rather than a mass tourism destination, like Angkor Wat.



### THE FUTURE OF FLIGHT

We all know that flying is bad for the climate. Before Corona, there were almost 200,000

flights every day. Corona has changed all that. It's predicted that the industry will not recover until 2022 or 2023. But does that mean that by 2022 we will again be emitting the same amount of CO2 as before? How can we combine environmental protection and our need for mobility? Do we need new aircraft and new aviation fuels – or should we simply fly less?

Evangelicals have even created their own Bible-themed attractions, rewriting the science books to educate their children. Meanwhile, in Georgia, a Christian militia lives in fear of atheists, and prepares for urban war.

#### INSIDE EFFINGHAM PRISON

In Effingham Prison, Georgia, white supremacist gangs rule. Here 80% of

the detainees are white - an anomaly in the American prison landscape. The 20 or so African-Americans all follow the rules imposed by the white gangs. We spent a month filming there and got close to several of the inmates. Housewife, Jenny, has just arrived, still in shock after receiving a 5 year sentence for drunk driving.

#### PRISON LIFE: JUSTICE IN JAPAN

We gained unprecedented access to two Japanese prisons to find out if

accusations that the system is inhumane are true. Here inmates must march to their worksites attached by a cord. The treatment of suspects in custody pushes many to confess to crimes which they did not commit, as was the case with one man who spent 46 years on death row.




### PRISON FOR PROFIT

powerful international uncontrolled corporations take over? In 'Prison for Profit', we follow investigative journalist Ruth Hopkins and the lives of former prisoners and prison warders from South Africa's Mangaung private prison, which is run by the controversial private security firm G4S. Leaked video footage filmed by prison guards shows the violent face of this notorious private prison from the inside.

Unknown to hundreds of millions of consumers is the fact that products contain "dirty mica", extracted using antiquated methods, close to slavery, in one of the poorest regions of the world. In Jarkhand, India, under the constant threat of landslides and toxic dust, children dig through the earth with their bare hands.

### STOLEN BLOOD ANTIQUITIES

Antiquities stolen from the Middle East have resurfaced in art markets all over the world. The pillaging

of archaeological artefacts began on an unprecedented scale with the destruction of Palmyra by ISIS and it continued with artefacts stolen from Iraq and Libya. Stolen antiquities have been exhibited at renowned galleries and sold around the world in online markets. In this investigation, we shadow European specialist police units and investigative archaeologists to reveal a sprawling criminal network.

# BHUTAN: THE DICTATORSHIP OF HAPPINESS

Buddhism is the only religion tolerated by the Wangchuck dynasty who have ruled the country for the last century. This ultra-conservative regime is closely intertwined with the Buddhist faith.








A Russian scientist on the border between genius and madman, a vanished ice age ecosystem, a climatic time bomb and a crazy plan to save the world.

Sergey proposes that millions of horses, bison, yaks once again roaming Siberia can stabilise permafrost and prevent a catastrophic scenario of runaway global warming. But the park itself remains an extremely funky operation, dominated by swarms of mosquitos and mud pits rather than thundering herds.

We follow Sergey and Nikita for over eight years as they try to stave off a worst case scenario of global environmental catastrophe and reshape humanity's relationship with the natural world.

### An Organised Crime

Horsemeat labelled as beef. Honey diluted with cheap sugar syrups. Counterfeit extravirgin olive oil. Food crime is a multi-billion dollar industry affecting everything from the cheapest to most expensive ingredient. 10% of what we eat is thought to be adulterated.

In Italy, entire sectors of the food industry are controlled by the mafia. All over the world, well-organised criminal networks work together to penetrate complex supply chains. Replacing one ingredient with a much cheaper substitute or faking a label involves little danger or cost for the criminals. The profits are enormous. But what are the risks to the consumer? How can we identify food fraud? And what can be done to stop it?

In this investigation, we follow the food fraud brigades and reveal how little we know about what we're eating. A global investigation into the counterfeit food industry.

Four years on from the fateful referendum that marked the beginning of the end for Great Britain's membership in the European Union, and the story is still unfolding. The saga has so far comprised of three main parts: the referendum, Theresa May and Boris Johnson.

We are now entering the final act of this Shakespearean drama: the negotiation phase that will finally determine the future of British-EU relations. Since March 2020, Boris Johnson has been faced with the task of navigating his country through a global pandemic as well as through Brexit.

This film, made entirely from archive footage from the House of Commons, gives a clear picture of the dramatic nature of government debates and the glaring contradictions across parties. The debates that unfold here are emblematic of the ideological war underway between populism and liberal democracy, at play over Europe and in the rest of the world.



Riccardo, an Italian final-year medical student, is going on Erasmus. The destination: Gaza, a war zone. He wants to become a war surgeon and is writing his thesis on explosive bullet wounds.

Entering Gaza is not easy. He needs permission from three different authorities: the Israeli army, the Palestinian Authority and Hamas. And upon arrival, the pressure mounts: his experience will determine the success of the exchange programme. The imminence of war doesn't help and he starts suffering panic attacks.

And when war is rekindled, Riccardo has to make many difficult choices. In crossing the border between Israel and the Gaza Strip, he also crossed the boundary between adolescence and adulthood.



It's the biggest scandal in German industrial history. For more than ten years, automobile manufacturers and suppliers working for lots of different companies lied to consumers and authorities by deliberately manipulating the exhaust emissions of their vehicles. With catastrophic consequences: Almost 20 million car owners worldwide were cheated. The reputation of Germany's car industry is ruined. And the consequences for human health and the environment are immense.

In this investigation, industry insiders reveal how this is the logical consequence of a culture of profit maximization at the expense of morality, decency and legality.

The main protagonists of our film are whistle-blowers fighting against powerful car bosses. An ex-engineer, an ex-manager, a lawyer – they all break their silence for the first time in front of the camera to reveal the criminal activities in Germany's car industry.
