Founded by Roch Bozino in 2005, Java Films rapidly established itself as one of Europe's leading independent distributors, providing pre-sales and distribution for documentaries. We pride ourselves on our strong, personal relationships with our producers and clients and place this at the centre of everything we do.

At Java, we're passionate about stories that explain the big issues of tomorrow. We only work with non-fiction and specialise in current affairs investigations, human rights, history and environmental films. Our boutique feature department takes on 6 – 8 feature documentaries a year, while our TV department works with approximately 60 – 80 titles per year.

Our priority is to ensure that our films are widely seen and accessible to everyone. To that end, Java is divided

into three departments, which work closely together. Our festival department focuses on securing suitable premieres and a long, non-theatrical run for our films. This typically runs for 12 – 36 months and is made up of both festival, non-theatrical and company screenings. Our digital department concentrates on placing films on all types of VOD platforms, as well as managing social media marketing and working with designers and outreach teams to create suitable artwork and visual assets. Meanwhile, our sales department works on securing TV broadcasts, educational deals and in-flight sales, through output deals and detailed market knowledge.

In 2024, our documentaries could be seen at 120 screenings and 115 festivals around the world, winning 24 awards and 4 special mentions.

## South China Sea: The Next Global Flashpoint?

**For centuries, Vietnam, the Philippines, Taiwan, Malaysia, Brunei and China have disputed territories in the South China Sea. But China's claims of overriding sovereignty over the entire sea, supported by annexations and aggressive military patrols, has turned the Sea into a global hotspot.**

been regularly harassed and attacked. We join a coast guard patrol and are soon surrounded by Chinese militias. They attack with water cannons and ram the patrol boat, damaging its navigation equipment. It's a move that could have easily killed the crew but attacks like this are regular occurrences.

On a deserted beach in the North of the Philippines, 200 heavily armed Marines train alongside Filipino soldiers. Never have the tensions between the Philippines and Beijing been so high and the United States is pulling out all the stops to prove they are ready to repel a Chinese invasion.

At the heart of these disputes are the Spratly Islands, an archipelago of islets and coral reefs, disputed by six countries. China has already annexed seven of the Spratly reefs and transformed them into military bases.

According to international law, the Scarborough Shoal belongs to the Philippines. But in 2012, China illegally seized it and prohibited access to outsiders. Since then, Filipino fishermen have

In Taiwan, the pressure is mounting. Xi Jinping has officially announced that the island is an 'inalienable' part of China and in Taipei, they are now planning for a possible military invasion: "I feel very scared" confides one woman. "China is nearby and there is always a threat."

## The Social Trap: 5 Women vs the Big 5

**Teenagers who are connected to their smartphones for more than five hours a day are 66% more likely to suffer suicidal symptoms than those who use it for just one hour a day. Faced with the ever-more-powerful tech giants, like Meta, Tiktok, Snapchat, X and Discord, how can we protect children and their childhood?**

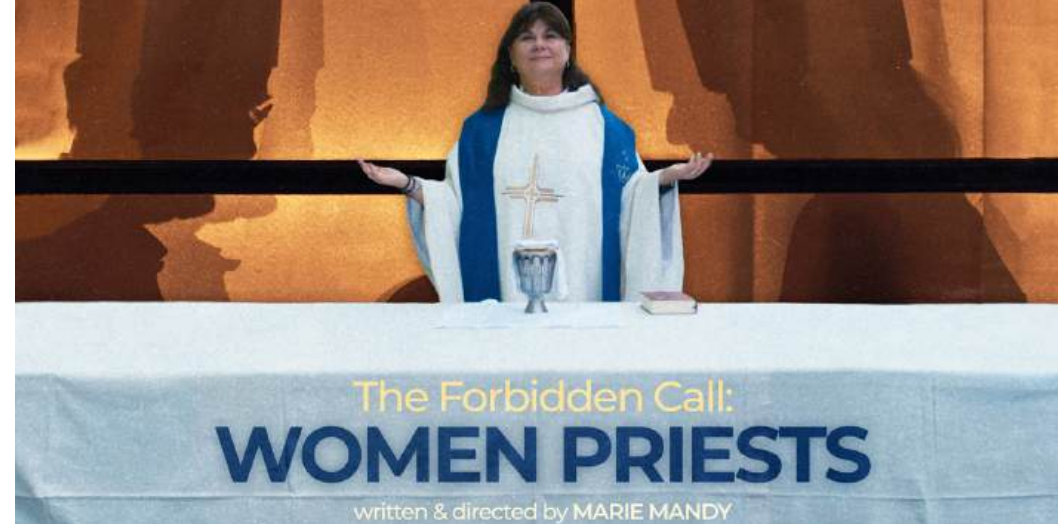
For the first time in history, state legislators and parents in the USA and Europe are joining forces to fight the digital giants. Among them are five women who have chosen to turn their daily lives upside down to fight back against the Big 5: Alexis, Elisabet, Sofia, Laure and Socheata.

Alexis, a victim of screen addiction, is determined to make her voice heard. She was among the first to take Meta to court, accusing

it of "inciting suicide". Today she is part of a collective of 1,200 families. Elisabet is a mother of three. From her Catalan village, she raised a veritable army in just a few days. Over 10,000 parents joined her WhatsApp group to fight for a 'phone-free youth'. As a result, Catalonia has banned smartphones in schools. Sofia is a psychiatrist and pioneer in the treatment of screen addiction in children, some are as young as seven. Socheata has been involved in the fight ever since her son was manipulated by an internet predator. She works alongside cybercrime police officers to track down pedophiles. Laure is a lawyer determined to change the laws that protect the Big 5.

Through the struggles of these women, we discover the extent to which digital control has become a major public health issue threatening the very lives of our children.



## The Forbidden Call: Women Priests

**Since their clandestine ordinations on a boat on the Danube in 2002, Catholic women priests have challenged the Vatican to denounce its misogyny. For the first time, women priests have succeeded in obtaining a dialogue with the Vatican, prompting cardinals and Pope Francis to take a stand on the forbidden subject of women's ordination.**

We follow three committed women in their quest to change doctrine. Jacqueline Straub is a Swiss theologian who feels a real vocation to be a priest. She has been writing relentlessly to successive popes for fifteen years, pleading for gender equality in the Church and for permission to be ordained. Christina Moreira was ordained in catacombs, following in the footsteps of the Danube "clandestine ordinations" which have seen the emergence of over 300 women priests worldwide.

Despite being excommunicated, she continues to exercise her priesthood in her Spanish community. Meanwhile, across the Atlantic, Myra Brown, an African-American priest, heads a parish of 1,500 faithful, defying prohibitions with unshakeable faith.

Together, these women lead an investigation into the heart of the Vatican, the last bastion of institutional misogyny, defying centuries of tradition, revisiting sacred texts and dismantling the theological, political and cultural arguments behind this unjust ban. For them, the issue of female ordination is the first step towards wider change within the Church: opening priests up to marriage, combating gender discrimination and accepting homosexual unions.



## Scandinavia: The New Cold War

The invasion of Ukraine changed everything for Russia's Scandinavian neighbours. 200 years of neutrality, which had previously created a sense of stability, was replaced with NATO membership. Finland, Norway and Sweden are now preparing for the possibility of war. Their citizens have been asked to stock up on water, tinned food and iodine tablets.

All three countries share land borders with Russia. Stockholm is only 500 kilometres from the military base at Kaliningrad, the Russian enclave between Poland and Lithuania. This proximity makes them fear an attack from the Russian giant, as they control highly strategic zones: the Baltic Sea and the Arctic. These countries, historically hostile to excessive militarization, have, in the space of a few months become Europe's bridgehead against Russian imperialism.

Sweden, Finland and Norway have decided to create a common military corridor crossing their territories in the Arctic, a strategic region likely to harbor 13% of the world's oil reserves and 30% of its undiscovered natural gas. A region that is now increasingly accessible thanks to the accelerating melting of the ice, which is also opening up new shipping lanes.

For Norway in particular, this represents a paradigm shift. Before the outbreak of war in Ukraine, the mayors of the country's north had created strong links between their municipalities and Russia, which wanted to open up a route to the Arctic.

## Sweden's Gang Violence

**A wave of gang violence and shootings in Sweden has taken everyone by surprise. The country now has one of the highest per capita rates of gun violence in the EU, with young teenagers being recruited as hitmen in ongoing gang wars. How did it come to this?**

In Sweden, children aged 15-17 can only be sentenced to a maximum of four years in closed youth care for murder. Children under the age of 15 cannot be prosecuted and, as a result, gangs target young teenagers. They start as young as eight or ten, acting as lookouts and guarding arms, before moving on to sell drugs and to work as killers for hire. Jobs are advertised online and Sweden's open culture – which allows for sensitive personal information like people's addresses, salaries and

who they live with to be published online – means it is very easy to track down targets.

We hear from teen hitmen who describe the process of their recruitment and how they felt alienated by Swedish society. "Swedes look at us differently because we are Arabs .... White people can have what they want," explains one.

And yet, there are also those trying to help: "A lot of the time, we forget that they are kids. A lot of the ones who get into the lifestyle are also getting manipulated and abused by adults selling them a dream that is not true."

This documentary explores the hidden stories behind the hostile face of Sweden's criminal gangs.



## Hell's Border: Haiti & the Dominican Republic

**This is the story of a border between two worlds that have nothing in common. Two states sharing the same territory: the Caribbean island of Hispaniola. To the east, the Dominican Republic, an El Dorado for tourists from all over the world. To the west, Haiti, the poorest country in the northern hemisphere. Since its president, Jovenel Moïse, was assassinated three years ago, Haiti has been in the hands of gangs. Insecurity and poverty have thrown thousands of Haitians onto the streets, with just one goal in mind: to flee to the Dominican Republic.**

Although the Haitian-Dominican Republic border is officially closed, it has become the epicentre of a large-scale human trafficking operation - one of the most lucrative industries in the region. Smugglers bribe the police to look the other way and hundreds of illegal immigrants cross the

border every day. We join one group making the crossing.

Once in the Dominican Republic, Haitians become slave laborers who keep the country's economy going. For \$2 a day, they cut sugarcane plants and cram into miserable shacks. Haitian workers account for 90% of the workforce on sugarcane and avocado plantations and 50% of construction and hotel workers.

In 2013, the Court of Santo Domingo declared "children born in the country to foreign parents no longer had Dominican nationality". Overnight, hundreds of thousands of Dominicans of Haitian origin found themselves treated as illegal aliens. Yolanda has lived in the Dominican Republic for ten years. All her children were born here. Since this decision, Yolanda and her children have been living illegally: it's impossible for them to receive medical care or go to school.

## Climate Refugees: A Global Challenge

**Already more than 30 million people flee their villages, regions or countries every year because of climate change. By 2050, it's estimated there will be between 200 million and 1 billion climate refugees. As extreme weather threatens the lives of hundreds of millions of people, how can the world best respond?**

Faced with these migrations, the international community seems incapable of agreeing on defining new protection and compensation. Currently there is no clear definition of a 'climate refugee', and climate refugees are not covered by the 1951 Refugee Convention. The spectre of

waves of unrestrained migration is brandished for populist purposes to justify the locking of borders.

But, in the absence of a global response, the countries and regions most affected by the climate change/migration problem are taking the initiative.

We explore these challenges through the prism of individual human stories and innovative initiatives in Asia, the Pacific and Latin America. In the long term, they could become models, well beyond their borders.



## Being a Woman in Afghanistan: Hell on Earth

We delve into the hell that has become the daily lives of women in Afghanistan since the Taliban returned to power in August 2021. The Taliban have made Afghanistan the worst country in the world for women. Women are now banned from high school and university, excluded from most jobs, forbidden to travel alone, wear make-up, show their faces or even to make their voices heard in public.

To show what life is like in this country, in the media's blind spot, we take an ambitious twofold approach. Thanks to an extremely rare visa, we were able to film in Afghanistan to ostensibly promote Afghan tourist sites, like the ruins of the famous Buddas of Bamyán, dynamited by the Taliban themselves 20 years earlier and now

promoted as a tourist attraction. But this was just a cover designed to show this country where no women are to be seen.

At the same time, secret footage shows the hidden face of Afghanistan: economic misery, rising depression and suicides. Several women across the country courageously agreed to film their daily lives on their cell phones, the last bastion of freedom. By replacing their faces with AI generated images, we protect their identities while retaining their humanity.

The constant back-and-forth between official propaganda and an immersion in the women's daily lives reveals the reality of Afghanistan's gender apartheid, unique in the world.

Since 1991, Turkmenistan has been ruled by an equally bizarre and ruthless dictatorship. Much like North Korea, the heads of state wield absolute power and have the freedom to act on a whim.

The Berdymukhamedov family has ruled Turkmenistan for two generations. The capital, Ashgabat, is a monument to megalomania and listed as the world's most expensive city. Every one of its buildings is constructed entirely of white marble, and only white cars are allowed on its pristine, deserted streets. The city holds the record for the largest star-shaped building, the largest horse-shaped stadium and the highest concentration of fountains.

Turkmenistan is famous for its countless absurd rules. There is a compulsory 11pm curfew and the

country is scattered with museums and immense golden statues glorifying the Berdymukhamedov regime. The dictator delights in singing songs that he himself has composed praising the country. He also enjoys administering justice in public, like on national TV, where he appears humiliating and sentencing ministers accused of corruption.

To uncover the secrets of this reclusive dictatorship, we discreetly joined a tourist group. Behind the opulence lies a brutal regime that suppresses and threatens any opposition. Only a tiny minority have benefited from the country's wealth, there is mass unemployment and extreme poverty.



## Love & Sex in Spain

**Repressed for 40 years by Franco's dictatorship, has Spain become Europe's most progressive country, ahead of the Scandinavian countries?**

Sexual liberation, feminism, menstrual leave, gay marriage... Spain is at the vanguard in liberal reforms. Since the Socialists came to power in 2018, the country has adopted a series of progressive laws that have made headlines all over the world. Here a minor can begin the process of changing their sex from the age of 12. The "Ley Trans" is Europe's most progressive law on LGBTIQ+ rights while another law, known as "solo sí es sí", established explicit consent as a rule in sexual relations and toughened penalties for rape and assault. These advances run counter to the image people have of the country as a Catholic, traditionalist, macho culture.

## Shrinking Space

**Israel's actions since the start of the war in banning UNRWA and restricting the activities of NGOs and UN agencies helping Palestinians have been well publicised. But this policy of targeting aid organisations can be traced back years earlier.**

In October 2021 Israel designated six West Bank Palestinian civil society organisations as terrorist organisations without any evidence.

"I didn't understand what had happened", explains Juana Ruiz, a 65 year-old Spanish aid worker who was arrested in April 2021, after 25 Israeli soldiers stormed into her home and accused her of "belonging to an illegal organisation". She was imprisoned for nearly a year. Three months later, it was the turn of fellow

health worker and nurse, 60 year old Shatha Odeh. She spent almost a year in illegal detention in Israeli prisons before being banned from providing health services to people. During her detention she lost about 20 kgs. "No one is safe here in Palestine", she laments.

Ubai Aboudi is the director of a research NGO: his phone is hacked by Pegasus. Tahreer Jaber is the director of a women's NGO: she and her family are threatened and harassed. All of them know they can be arrested at any time.

In this moving film, we hear from the aid workers targeted, arrested and imprisoned. How long can they continue carrying out their task of serving their people and defending human rights in Palestine?





## Tajikistan: In the Shadow of ISIS

In March 2024, an Islamist commando group massacred 145 people in a concert hall on the outskirts of Moscow. The four assailants came from Tajikistan. For the past decade, this small ex-Soviet republic in Central Asia has been one of the main breeding grounds for jihadism. Why?

In a basic shack, an hour's drive south of the capital, lives Gulrakat. Her home has neither running water nor electricity. Like more than a million young Tajiks, her son, Dalerdzhon Mirzoyev, migrated to Russia to find work. But in March 2024, Dalerdzhon was identified as the leader of the Moscow concert attack. Showing signs of obvious torture, he was paraded on television. His mother still finds it hard to accept that her son became a jihadist. "How he could have fallen into this group, I don't know. I think they tricked him because he doesn't speak Russian well. Otherwise he would have understood

the danger and been able to save himself." Now she looks after his four young children, who will probably never see him again.

Tajikistan appears to be the new breeding ground for terrorism in the region. But President Emomali Rahmon, a former soldier in the Soviet army who has been in power since 1992, has declared war on radical Islam. He has turned his overwhelmingly Muslim country into an ultra-secular regime. Today, women are banned from wearing the hijab or burqa and men are forbidden from growing a beard longer than three centimetres. Minors are not allowed to attend mosques.

Apart from cotton, Tajikistan has very few natural resources. But thanks to China's the New Silk Road, a tiny minority close to those in power are living the high life. On weekends, bars, clubs and discos are packed and vodka flows freely.

## The Uighur Crisis in Xinjiang: A Disappeared People

For years, China has been accused of systematically persecuting the Uyghurs in Xinjiang. Through mass deportations, internment in so-called "reeducation" camps, forced abortions, and the destruction of cultural heritage, the Beijing regime has implemented a relentless policy of repression.

Today, China claims that order has been restored in Xinjiang. That the region is thriving, and that it is open to tourism. But this new phase of Beijing's plan is just as brutal as the previous ones. Under the guise of economic development, China is accelerating the sinicization of the region: Uyghurs are forced into labor, their traditions reduced to a mere folkloric show for Chinese visitors and their mosques either demolished or turned into tourist attractions.

This investigation by a leading specialist on the Uyghur crisis for over 25 years, collects harrowing testimonies from survivors, exiled activists, and international experts. Spanning China, Turkey, Kazakhstan, and Europe, it sheds light on the methods of repression and intimidation employed by Beijing, even beyond its borders, to silence any opposition.

With exclusive footage and in-depth analysis, this documentary unveils the extent of Xinjiang's "Potemkinization"—a carefully orchestrated spectacle designed by the regime to disguise the eradication of an entire people and their religion and culture.



## Blank Plate: Creating the Best Restaurant in the World

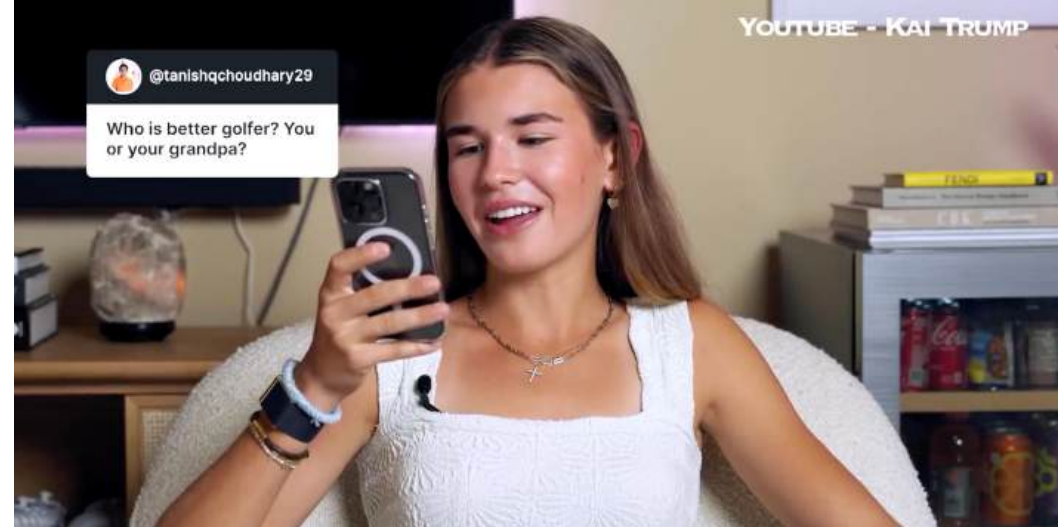

## The Price of War: Ukraine's Lost Youth

For the past three years, the youth of Ukraine have been growing up in a war-zone. While the fighting intensifies, the number of victims increases. The lives of millions of young Ukrainians - like Napoléon, Plombir, Timur, Hannah - have been irrevocably changed.

Plombir, 26, volunteered for the army and soon found himself on the Eastern Front. In February 2023, he stepped on a landmine. He has since joined the ranks of the war's 40,000 Ukrainian amputees. At 15 years old, Hannah is just one of five million pupils who no longer has access to education. After the bombing of her home at the start of the war, she has lived mainly in underground shelters and makeshift accommodation. She's terrified of a Russian offensive into Kharkiv, Ukraine's second-city.

Napoléon, a young father and soldier, can never speak of the realities of his daily life with his three year old son. Meanwhile Timur, 26, refuses to enlist. He has, nevertheless, chosen to position himself on the frontline, having created a charity that aims to rescue citizens of the Kharkiv region.

## China's Secret Economic War

China is waging a clandestine and merciless war to become the world's leading military and economic power. Through a combination of industrial espionage, technology theft and the establishment of networks of influence abroad, they hope to achieve this by 2049 - the centenary of the Chinese Communist Party's accession to power. It's estimated that China's actions have already caused billions of euros worth of damage to Western economies.

Exceptionally, a former top Airbus executive recounts how China imported and then concealed an Airbus A320 so that it could be dismantled and copied. Other directors describe how their work was stolen and copied while the director of Europe's Galileo space program reveals Beijing's ploy to neutralize Europe's satellite positioning system.

Secret agents, commando operations and state scandals kept under wraps: for many months, we have been investigating how Chinese power operates abroad to make China the world's leading power.

## Syria: Between Hope and Fear

After half a century of dictatorship, Syria is undergoing an historic upheaval following the overthrow of President Bashar Al-Assad by insurgents from the Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS). We capture the first moments of this tumultuous transition and hear from the Syrian population, torn between hope for renewal and fear of the unknown.

We followed the step-by-step installation in power of new leaders from the rebel movement. From the gilded halls of the presidential palace to the gloomy cells of the infamous Saydnaya prison, the scene of brutal repression, this film lifts the veil on the vestiges of an authoritarian system.

While some exiles are contemplating a return to their homeland, others are opting for exodus, fearful of the new regime's direction. Who are HTS and what are the real intentions of the jihadist rebels led by Abu Mohammed Al-Joulani. What will be the fate of minorities, particularly the Alawites, in this new political configuration?

## Hezbollah: The Manhunt

## Syria's Jihadist Children: A Lost Cause or Hope for Redemption?

In the prisons of Al-Hol and Al-Roj camps, Kurdish forces are managing what many Western countries regard as a time bomb: 60,000 prisoners affiliated with the Islamic State. They believe it is only a matter of time before ISIS return and frees them.

Adem Clain's father was responsible for the 2015 Paris attacks. He arrived in Syria at the age of 12 and is now being held in a high-security prison. Kurdish authorities consider him to be a disruptive and potentially dangerous and keep him away from the other teenagers at the de-radicalization center. He claims he is being judged for his father's crimes.

We met other sons of jihadists who all arrived in Syria when they were just children. The "lion cubs of the Caliphate" were presented as the future generation of terrorists, destined to carry out attacks in the West. Today, they are morally broken teenagers, who often bear the scars of war.

## Jordan: The Surprising Kingdom

For King Abdullah of Jordan, President Trump's suggestion that Palestinians in Gaza should be resettled there threatens the very survival of his country. Trump's comments have highlighted Jordan's dependence on US aid and raised existential questions over the country's identity.

The kingdom relies on the \$1.5 billion of US aid it receives every year and 3,000 US troops are stationed there. But it is also home to more than 2.39 million registered Palestinian refugees and 60% of Jordan's population are of Palestinian origin. The royal family plays a delicate balancing act, keen to avoid angering its Western allies while supporting the Palestinian people. As well as the Palestinians, Jordan also hosts approximately 650,000 Syrian refugees.

Before the war, tourism accounted for 15% of the GDP. But now, tourists have stopped coming, adding to the country's economic problems...

## A City within a City: New York's Orthodox Jews

Ultra Orthodox Jews in America make up a very visible, yet inaccessible community. Recognisable by their outfits, they have a strict dress code and live by even stricter rules. We gained exclusive access into their world and hear from a family expelled from the community.

Orthodox Jews live in a vacuum, on the fringes of the modern world. They marry solely within their community, and – as contraception is banned in most circumstances – their families often exceed six children. Their entire life is determined by religion, following judaic practices which have not changed since the 18th century. The sexes are strictly segregated, they speak Yiddish, the language of Eastern European Jews before the Second World War. Within the most rigorous branches, men devote their entire life to the study of religion, and women only work in mainstream society to provide for the family's needs. Children are educated in Orthodox schools which focus mainly on religious education.

## Cape Verde: The Reality Beyond the Resorts

Endless beaches, majestic mountains and villages with multi-coloured houses, Cape Verde become has one of the new favourite destinations for Instagrammers. Here tourists can enjoy a week in an all-inclusive resort for as little as 700€, including travel. But virtually none of this benefits the islands. Here, lack of opportunities and a severe draught means that some women have to resort to stealing sand from the sea floor to survive.

On many of the island's beaches, the sand has completely disappeared: local women have been stealing it for the construction industry. Now they have to fetch it from the bottom of the sea. These women carry no less than 50 kg of sand on their heads on each trip. Most of them can't swim so every time they enter the sea, they risk their lives. For this, they are paid approximately 10€ a week.

It's hardly rained in the past seven years. While the tourists enjoy numerous swimming pools, each local family is restricted to only one or two 25 litres container of water a day.

## Dirty Deals in Pattaya

In 2023, we reported on how pedophiles were exploiting post-COVID poverty in Thailand to abuse children. We return to the place where it all began, checking in with stories that have continued since the first film aired, and examining whether any real reform is happening, or is even on the horizon.

Two years ago we exposed the case a German suspect arrested for child abuse in Pattaya who was able to flee to Germany by paying a bribe. After the film aired, Frankfurt prosecutors took him into custody. He admitted on camera to taking a minor to his room "to have sex" but denied any abuse.

The revelations sparked political outrage in Thailand, leading to a government inquiry, but the existence of tangible reform remains in question. Despite TUI removing Pattaya hotels from its programs, this follow-up film - 'Dirty Deals in Pattaya' - reveals how child exploitation still persists in luxury hotels.

## Peru: Life at 4,000 Metres

They live at extreme altitudes, at more than 4,000, sometimes 5,000 meters high. Where oxygen levels are two to four times lower than at sea level and human life is almost impossible. In Peru more than a million people live on the high plateaus and have adapted to this merciless environment.

Perched at 5,300 meters, La Rinconada is the highest city in the world. An immense shanty town where more than 50,000 people are settled, crowded at the foot of a gold mine. The city is not only the most dangerous in Peru, it is also the most polluted. The mercury used to separate the nuggets from the earth poisons the surrounding rivers and lakes. The water has become toxic, and residents are forced to carve blocks out of the glacier overlooking the city to get drinking water.

For some, the Peruvian highlands are an inexhaustible source of culinary inspiration. Virgilio Martinez, voted best chef in the world in 2023, opened his restaurant in Moray, a small village perched at an altitude of 4,000 meters.

## Narcos: The French Connection

**On May 14, 2024, a prison convoy was ambushed at a tollbooth in Northern France. The target was Mohammed Amra, a repeat offender involved in drug trafficking. The heavily armed attackers showed no mercy, killing two prison officers and severely injuring three others. It took nearly a year to track him down and arrest him in Romania.**

The 'Arma affair' is symbolic of a powerful and quick escalation in violence linked to the drug-trade. In 2023, in Marseille, around thirty young men were killed and one hundred injured in clashes between two rival gangs, amounting to a level of violence never before seen in the city.

For field agents, police officers and magistrates alike, it is the result of growing "narco-culture", a term coined by South American cartels: a culture where allegiance to the gang takes precedence over everything. This investigation delves into a pocket of extreme, drug-related violence in France.

## The Crossing

After the worst disaster in the English Channel for some 30 years, 'The Crossing' forensically investigates exactly why at least 31 lives were lost in the busiest shipping lane in the world and challenges the discourse around asylum seekers.

With the families of those who died at the centre, 'The Crossing' establishes who was on board the doomed boat, where they had come from and the reasons why they risked everything that night. Material filmed by the victims themselves reveal how separate lives came together days before tragedy, showing how people support each other in the most challenging circumstances. Video and text messages, pieced together, also expose key members of the gang responsible for the boat, and testimony from one of only two survivors lays bare the truth of how pleas to emergency services to help the sinking dinghy went ignored.

For anyone interested in understanding one of the most potent human and political issues in Europe, 'The Crossing' is a must watch.

## She Rises Up

“She Rises Up” chronicles the remarkable journeys of three women who are working to lift their communities out of poverty through the local businesses they fight the odds to maintain. Gladys Yupanqui of Peru founded a mini-market and is looking to expand. Magatte Wade of Senegal is building a cosmetics manufacturing company. Selyna Peiris of Sri Lanka is expanding the textile company founded by her mother.

Nearly one third of all countries have laws that stifle a women’s access to work. They limit access to bank accounts, property inheritance, and many types of jobs. These countries have some of the highest poverty rates in the world.

‘She Rises Up’ reveals the role entrepreneurs and small businesses can play in women gaining financial independence, and ultimately reducing poverty for all. Gladys, Magatte and Selyna’s stories are each unique unto themselves, yet they share a common theme: the critical importance of local businesses to emerging economies. These women prevail over issues that are not faced by the multinational corporations that come in.

## Outgrow the System

“Change the system, not the climate” is a common demand in the climate movement. But what kind of system do we actually want? In the midst of humanity’s worst crisis, the pioneers stand ready. Meet the new economic perspectives that have the potential to change the world at its core.

The original meaning of the word “economy” is “household management”. The economy of today however, is not householding, but rather consuming our finite natural resources at an alarming pace. “Outgrow the System” explores how we can return to the essence of the term and design an economic system that genuinely manages our scarce resources.

Beyond the narrow mainstream debate and the teachings of business schools, numerous new economic ideas and practices are emerging. They challenge old assumptions and offer fresh perspectives on how we can reorganize our production and consumption, in order to ensure our survival as a species on this planet.

## Dreams

The oneiric state. A dream-like state experienced while awake that allows the dreamer to reach and explore inner worlds. Charlotte, Elona and Raphaëlle are able to enter into this state to explore and create extraordinary worlds. They create fictional universes which they share on social networks. At the dawn of adulthood, they almost lose their way, before finding themselves.

Using ‘shifting’, a self-hypnosis technique, Charlotte mentally travels through fictional universes, visiting places she creates from scratch or inspired by fictional worlds she loves. To her, immersive daydreams offer a refuge from the loneliness and difficulties of the real world. But tensions run high in the online shifting community, and Charlotte has to choose between her dreams and reality.

When she sleeps, Elona directs her dreams: since childhood, she has learned to shape her “lucid dreams” according to her desires. But little by little, anxiety has gotten the better of her: how can she let go when she is used to controlling everything, day and night?

## Ukraine: A Flower Among the Ashes

On the Ukrainian front line, in the trenches, in shelters, or under the shade of a glade, a small miracle of humanity unfolds: “troubadour-soldiers,” who themselves bear the invisible scars of war, offer a moment of music that takes on a uniquely emotional dimension.

It’s a cocoon of poetry, where music soothes the wounds of conflict. Joined by poets and puppeteers alike, they work to revive and celebrate Ukrainian culture. This is the first time in the history of warfare that such a brigade has been formed.

Armed with their instruments, these troubadour-soldiers tour the front line with the aim of turning their performances into spaces where everyone is invited to lay down a piece of themselves, a poignant reminder that even amid the devastation of war, beauty can still blossom...

A symbol of the new Indian success story, Sean Sherman was named among the 100 most influential personalities of 2023 by Time magazine. In his gourmet restaurant, recipes are made exclusively from ingredients that were present in the United States before the arrival of European settlers in the 17th century. Johnny Tail Feathers is trying to reconnect with his roots by reintroducing the sacred bison to the Blackfeet Reservation in Montana.

From the vibrant, shimmering pow wows that bring together thousands of natives in New Mexico to the new oil Eldorado of the Dakotas, we plunge into the America of the Amerindians.



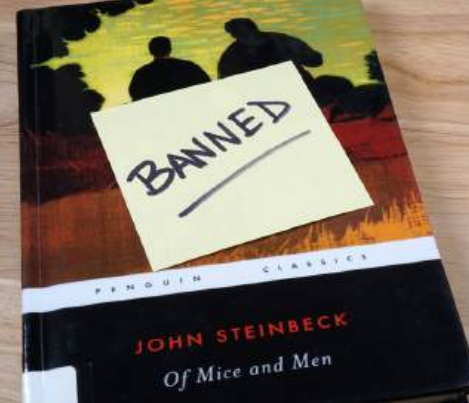

## Living on the Fringe: Inside the Roma Camps

**The Roma are one of the most closed communities in France, and also one of the most discriminated against.**

Five years ago, eight hundred Roma illegally settled on the outskirts of Nantes. We take a look at this true town-within-a-town, with its church, garage, bar and more than one hundred caravans. Living conditions throughout the camp are basic. Electricity comes from an illegal tap of a nearby power cable and is unstable and unsafe – earlier that year, one resident was electrocuted. Large families live in caravans or cobbled-together shacks.

Many of the residents here work as fruit pickers in the surrounding area for the minimum wage, keeping the region's farms running. Their wages support the rest of the community. Some turn to robberies and smuggling, where a few hours work can bring in the equivalent of a week's minimum wage. The presence of this camp provokes the anger of local residents, who blame them for all sorts of troubles: vandalism, burglaries and harassment.

How can one explain this seemingly sudden focus on books, in school and public libraries? What is behind this rise in censorship? This film follows four stories that illuminate and explain the evolution of this newest battleground in America's long culture war.

## Israel: Ministers of Chaos

**Two men, Itamar Ben Gvir and Bezalel Smotrich, are driving the radical right-wing agenda of Benjamin Netanyahu's government. Who are they? What is their ultimate goal?**

Itamar Ben Gvir and Bezalel Smotrich are the heirs of two ideological currents that were once marginal: Kahanism and religious Zionism. Today, they are throwing all their weight behind their ideological agenda: imposing Jewish supremacist legislation and re-founding biblical Israel.

Benjamin Netanyahu's government, the most right-wing in the country's history, has continued to deepen the internal divisions in Israeli society and has led the country to face the worst existential threat in its history since its creation in 1948. We investigate the influence of Ben Gvir and Smotrich over this government to reveal how they sow chaos in order to advance their ultimate project: the imposition of Jewish law on "Greater Israel", from the sea to the Jordan River, and thus the annexation of the West Bank, Gaza and even beyond.

## America XXL: American Rednecks

Often used as an insult to describe poor, uneducated, rural Americans, the term 'redneck' is being embraced by a new generation who are viscerally proud of their country and its traditions.

The Redneck festival in Texas is one of the biggest gatherings in the country. Over 10,000 people gather at this four day festival to celebrate their XXL cars, designed to be as polluting as possible, or compete in naked mud jumps or downhill beer runs.

In recent years, the new redneck generation has also been able to count on a musical movement that proudly asserts their customs: country rap. In Tennessee, Shocka Hustleman, the rising star of the genre, lives out his "American dream": big polluting engines and guns. He could easily double his salary by leaving Tennessee but for him, being a redneck is a way of life. But for these people, often poor, living in remote areas where the economic crisis has left thousands of workers unemployed, the pitfalls are many: alcoholism, drug addiction, domestic violence... Where is redneck America headed?

## America XXL: The Hidden Side of Los Angeles

It's the symbol of the American dream. The film capital of the world has become a beacon for Americans and expatriates in search of the American dream. But for many, the glitz and glamour of the City of Angels has lost its lustre.

Just 10 km from the studios, the notorious Skid Row district is still going strong. Here, 4,757 homeless people live in makeshift shelters or on the asphalt. If just a few years ago, the homeless area was confined to these 4 blocks of Downtown Los Angeles, it now extends all the way to the Pacific coast. This is due to an unprecedented housing crisis. In the richest state in the US, housing has become almost impossible to come by. As a result, Californians are abandoning their homes to live in motorhomes or converted vehicles.

Violent crime is also increasing. More people are being killed in LA than in other big cities. Armed settlements between gangs result in 1,000 shootings every year. We take a closer look at this destroyed California, from Skid Row to the southern suburbs. Gangs, crime, homelessness and a distressed middle class.

## America XXL: Land of Excess

**Bigger, better, stronger: the United States is the land of excess. In the country with the highest obesity rate in the world, food eating competitions are organised like sports tournaments. Here life-coaches encourage their millions of followers into uncontrolled over-consumption while groups of men compete to see who can build the most polluting machine.**

Deep in the heart of Florida, Carlos owns a dozen vehicles, each bigger than the last. Carlos and his friends belong to a group of exhaust-fume fanatics called the Coal Rollers, who like to film themselves smiling as they inhale toxic fumes from their 4x4 diesel cars. It's a practice that sometimes goes so far as modifying diesel engines to emit a thick black smoke that is particularly harmful to health and the environment.

This film dives into the heart of XXL America and the people determined to live their lives with no limits.

## Israel's Fractured Society

Israel is at a crucial crossroads in its history. The initial shockwave following Hamas' attack has been replaced by an explosive mix of anger, determination, and division within Israeli society.

Netanyahu's ability to maintain power is balancing on fragile coalitions with ultra-religious factions. Thirteen of the twenty-nine government ministers are from this movement, including the controversial Minister of National Security, Itamar Ben Gvir, and Minister of Finance, Bezalel Smotrich. Their vision? An Israel whose borders are dictated by sacred texts, spanning across the entirety of the Palestinian territories.

Settlement expansion is intensifying in the West Bank. In July, the government orchestrated the most substantial seizure of Palestinian land in three decades, appropriating 1,200 hectares. This policy is welcomed warmly by some of the West Bank's most radical settlers. We met these extremist settlers.

Through personal stories from people on both sides of the conflict and powerful footage, 'Favela Frontlines' takes you straight to the heart of the battle between police and drug traffickers in Brazil.

On average, one policeman is killed every two days in Brazil. There are 60,000 homicides every year. In this series, stories are interspersed with interviews with judges, journalists, slum residents and historians. They reflect on Brazil's public safety policy of the past three decades, the impact of social inequality and the legacy of slavery. As sociologist Luiz Eduardo Soares explains: "Police brutality wouldn't exist without tacit society authorisation."

For one gang member, it's very simple: "When I was 10, they slapped me in the face. Now I carry a rifle. Now, you can't slap me in the face."

### Episode One: Brazil that Works

The myth of the vigilantes, the reality of a nation designed to be based on a power project for a restricted elite, and the advent of the Militia in Brazil.

### Episode Two: War on Drugs

Police operations in the peripheries of Brazil are the primary focus of the War on Drugs, with the objective of criminalizing the minorities that inhabit the region. However, who benefits from this dynamic of confrontation?

### Episode Three: In the Name of God

Throughout its history, Brazil has advocated for the annihilation and domestication of indigenous, black, and impoverished individuals in the name of a state that exclusively serves a particular privileged group

### Episode Four: Stolen Dreams

The black and impoverished population of Rio de Janeiro is subjected to genocide on a daily basis, a terror project that operates within a logic of violence on the opposite side of Brazil's postcard.

## International Adoptions: A Global Scandal

Over the past sixty years, over a million ‘orphans’ were adopted by Western families from around the world. Now many are discovering their past was a lie.

From the children who were stolen from their mothers during the Pinochet dictatorship, to Africa’s fake orphans, international adoption is at the heart of an unprecedented scandal. We join investigative journalists, activists and researchers in South Korea, Sweden, France, Chile, Germany, Holland and Switzerland. How did this colossal, lucrative market manage to prosper? And why does it live on today?

In many cases, these practices are coming to light largely due to pressure from adopted children who have grown into adults. Upon discovering the dubious conditions surrounding their adoptions, many begin to search for their biological parents and demand explanations. A search now made possible thanks to social media, the internet and the availability of ancestry tracing websites.

## Haiti: The Iron Grip of the Gangs

In Port-au-Prince, nearly three million people live in the grips of all-out gang war. We spent a fortnight filming in and around the Haitian capital, speaking to a population held hostage by this drawn-out crisis.

Gangs now control more than 80% of the city, and their notorious spokesman Jimmy Chérizier, also known as “Barbecue”, says they’re not counting on laying down their weapons any time soon. “We demand to be at the negotiating table. If not, we will continue to fight.” Barbecue is the frontman of a powerful alliance of the capital’s gangs. Instead of fighting each other, the groups have united and turned their firepower on the state, forcing prime minister Ariel Henry to resign.

Today, the gangs control most of Port-au-Prince’s seafront. In the lower shantytowns of Port-au-Prince, the gangs’ bastions, thousands of people remain. Murders, kidnappings, gang rapes and fires are common and no end to the crisis seems in sight.

## Sweden's Criminal Gangs

shootings in Sweden that has taken everyone by surprise.

Sweden now has one of the highest per capita rates of gun violence in the EU, with young teenagers being recruited as hitmen in ongoing gang wars. Most of the gang members come from migrant backgrounds and right-wing politicians have been quick to blame immigration, however the situation is more complicated. Poverty, segregation and a lack of opportunities have made it very hard for many migrants and their children to integrate while growing inequality between the rich and poor has fuelled the rise of the gangs. Veteran police officers, gang members, teenage hitmen and victims of gang violence, share their firsthand accounts of the situation.



## Milei's Argentina

## The 'Tradwives' of America

This trend, promoted by numerous Instagram influencers, advocates a strict return to traditional values: the woman stays at home to look after the family, bake bread and happily submits to her husband, while the man works and provides for the family. But while the influencers promoting this lifestyle earn tens of thousands a month, most tradwives are completely dependent on their husbands. Former tradwife, Enitza, is keen for people to understand the realities of this lifestyle. After ten years as a tradwife and four children she realised she wanted a better life for her daughters. But when she requested a divorce, her problems really started...

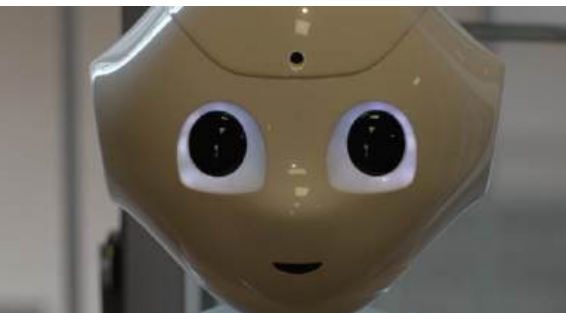

or merely paranoia amplified by social media? 'Armed and Divided We Stand' explores how the pandemic, the Trump and George Floyd protests, the January 6th Capitol assault, the Ukraine war, and the new Cold War with Russia and China are affecting US society. These events have driven many, regardless of their political views, to arm themselves and embrace "prepper" culture, reflecting fears of a total collapse and a dystopian future.

This episode of the Emmy Award winning series "Point of No Return" delves into the intense polarisation and increasing tensions in the US during the 2024 presidential campaign. It addresses the widespread fear that, regardless of the November election outcome, the nation will face further division, protests, social unrest, and even potential violence.



## Japan: The Utopia of AI Robots

to many of its problems. Are we at a point of no return with the onset of AI?

In Japan, the government, scientists and most of the population see AI and robots as a solution to many of their problems. The Japanese perception of robots and AI is very different from the Western one, for reasons as diverse as the particular demographic needs of an increasingly aging society, the influence of manga and anime, or spiritual beliefs. But does everyone in Japan really believe that the future could be a utopia where we will work less, live longer, merge with AI, and where it might even help us conquer space?

Are we at a point of no return when it comes to how Europe and the UK treat illegal migrants? Is dehumanising and criminalising migrants the answer to a problem that is predicted to increase?



Thousands of illegal migrants, including families with young children and unaccompanied minors, hide in the forests near Calais and Dunkirk in France. The UK has become their last hope to start a new life but the journey is extremely dangerous, and the French police are determined to stop them. Even if they manage to cross, England's 'hostile environment' policy and strict immigration laws mean they have no guarantee of being allowed to stay. In this episode of 'Point of No Return', we witness life in the Calais camps and accompanies the volunteers and activists of Utopia 56, an independent network that offers assistance and information 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and monitors the behaviour of the police forces and the compliance with the basic protocols for the protection of migrants' rights.

## Climate Change Resistance

Two controversial pipelines, the TransMountain Expansion Project (TMX) and Coastal GasLink (CGL), are expanding and threatening the natural habitats of historically oppressed First Nations in Canada. Being a land defender comes at a cost: harassment, detentions by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), and threats from private security. But in the face of setbacks, these indigenous activists press on: "we are still fighting; this dance is not over yet." We hear the stories of the indigenous communities on the receiving end of these huge pipelines, and their fight for justice for humans and nature.

**The Caudillo continues to cast a long shadow on Spanish society. How is it that a country known for being a progressive beacon, a country which had the Chilean dictator Augusto Pinochet arrested for crimes against humanity in 1998, is unable to come to terms with its own past? As the fiftieth anniversary of Franco's death approaches, to what extent is the rise in historical revisionism and the memory of Franco empowering the Spanish far right?**

Despite recent laws forbidding glorifying the Spanish Civil War and excusing Francoism, the 'Cara al sol' hymn to Franco is regularly heard at Vox rallies. This extreme right-wing party has adopted Franco's narrative on Spanish national identity and made the rehabilitation of the dictator a key part of its electoral campaign. Every November 20, the date of the Franco's

death, some twenty churches in Spain still hold masses in memory of the dictator. In Madrid, the Franco Foundation, set up to "honor the memory" of the general, still receives subsidies. It can count on the support of Madrid's current mayor, Jose Luis Martinez Almeida, a self-proclaimed fascist. Among other things, he had a mausoleum dedicated to the 3,000 people shot in the ravines of the capital's largest cemetery between 1940 and 1945 demolished.

Some institutions, such as the Spanish Church, co-responsible with Franco's regime for the theft of thousands of babies from Spanish maternity wards, still refuse to open their archives, despite the memorial laws that oblige them to do so.

In Spain, after decades of silence, never has there been so much talk about the Civil War and Franco as there is today.



## Cuba & Alaska

Leaving their civilian lives behind, two young Ukrainian women enrol in the army as military paramedics. There they find violence, pain and sadness, but also friendship, love and dreams of a life without war.

Both Alaska and Cuba volunteered for military service and work as partners in the same unit, serving in the middle of the war-torn, desolate East Ukraine. Despite being very different, they became close friends. Director Yegor Troyanovsky filmed their lives since the summer of 2022, capturing both moments of respite and joy during rotations and the stark horrors of war, where battles against death and the loss of comrades cast long shadows.

Cuba and Alaska have faced challenging tests of fate. Alaska was injured in 2023 after an attack by Russian drones. She had to undergo more than six months of rehabilitation. Step by step, she learned to walk again and is now back on the frontlines.

This group of military personnel, scientists and science-fiction scriptwriters has been commissioned by the French Ministry of Defence to imagine the wars of the future. Some of their work has just been classified as a defence secret. At Arquus, teams are finalizing a 100% autonomous military logistics convoy, with no pilot on board. Meanwhile, near

Bordeaux, start-up Icarus Swarms is working on swarms of drones capable of coordinating with AI to carry out grouped attacks.

In Ukraine, Ivan Sybyriakov coordinates several high-tech drone manufacturers who are developing low-cost, lethal weapons capable of curbing the numerical superiority of the Russian enemy. We discover these secret factories, which operate around the clock, and follow the tactical units that use them on the front line.

But the use of such intelligent equipment raises many legal and ethical questions. In China and Russia, weapons programmed to kill by themselves, without any human intervention, are already in use.



## The Country I Love: The Men who Made Berlusconi

He was the first of the great populists. A media tycoon who used his television network to take on the establishment and become Prime Minister, paving the way for Trumpism. When Silvio Berlusconi came to power, he turned to the same people who had built his media empire to help him run Italy. Now, three decades on, these men reflect on how they married television, entertainment and populism to create one of the most powerful political discourses of our time. And how they profoundly regret opening that Pandora's box.

Enzo Ghigo, Giancarlo Galan, Carlo Freccero and Carlo Momigliano. They were all dynamic young executives, aged between 25 and 30, when they found themselves at the heart of the Berlusconi

We went to meet them to find out where it all went wrong.

**No one has come to symbolise Ukraine more than its battered President Volodymyr Zelensky. By staying in Kyiv when the Russians invaded his country, he changed the course of the conflict. But the story of Zelensky is one of contradictions. Featuring rare access to President Zelensky, the people who have known him since his childhood as well as photos, film archives and never-before-seen eyewitness accounts, this film paints a picture of Volodymyr Zelensky and Ukraine.**

When he campaigned for the Presidency in 2019, Volodymyr Zelensky presented himself as a new man: young, with no political past, different from the Russian apparatchiks in place before independence in 1991 or the oligarchs left behind. Yet Volodymyr Zelensky was born in 1978, at a time when the big Soviet brother was extending his hold

and imprint over all the countries of the empire. The fierce nationalist who today speaks only Ukrainian received a Soviet education and grew up speaking Russian.

To understand this transformation, one has to go back to the early years. Featuring an interview with Zelensky, this film is based around the men and women who have known and worked with Volodymyr from his earliest childhood right up to the present day. Filmed solely in Ukraine, in Kyiv and in Kryvyi Rih, Zelensky's hometown. It mixes archives, filming and interviews with people who directly know him. Just Zelensky and the people who know him best.

Directed by renowned French documentary filmmaker Yves Jeuland, respected French journalist Ariane Chemin and historian and documentalist, Lisa Vapné, this is a film that will remain relevant for years to come.



## Sexless Japan: A Demographic Timebomb?

In Japan, strict social codes dictate everything, down to people's private lives. Men and women are struggling to meet and form relationships while a 2024 survey revealed that 44% of Japanese marriages are sexless. As a result, the country is gradually depopulating. But Japan is determined to do everything in its power to reverse this demographic curve.

The population of Japan is predicted to fall from 125 million today to just 88 million by 2065. The country can no longer finance the explosion in healthcare and pension spending, and the debt is mounting. But authorities are stepping up. In Tokyo, where the birth rate is less than one child per woman, City Hall even has a small team playing Cupid. The municipal department has just launched an AI-powered dating app to match the capital's singles. And those not keen on new technologies can opt for a konkatsu, a

kind of singles camp where friendly organizers run games to put participants at ease and encourage romance.

Nagi, in the Osaka region, is one of the few Japanese towns where children's cries can be heard. Here, a scene almost unreal in the archipelago, we even come across large families! So much so, that town councillors and government officials from all over the country flock here to try and discover the well-kept secret of the 'city of children'.

But in Japan, sexuality is often a solitary activity. And the arrival of AI and virtual reality in the field of sex toys isn't exactly encouraging the younger generation to take on a real partner. Japan now has the oldest population in the world, with one in three inhabitants is over 65.

**To his detractors, Javier Milei is rude, ignorant and a danger to democracy. He's also undoubtedly one of the most popular politicians in the world and the new face of populism. We profile Argentina's chainsaw-wielding president and meet his closest supporters, like his hairdresser and ex-girlfriend, Lilia Lemoine, now also an MP, or his personal clairvoyant who regularly passes on advice from his late dog..**

It seems like the dead dog's advice might be working because, after his first year in power, inflation is down from 25.5% to 2.4%. There's a \$19 billion trade surplus and 5% growth expected in 2025. Like tens of thousands of other tax exiles, Juan was able to repatriate part of his fortune and is now investing heavily in real estate and commerce. Landowner Alessandro saw his taxes fall, along with the environmental constraints for raising his 200,000 cows.

## Argentina According to Milei

But Milei's extreme spending cuts have hit the poorest hardest. The Vargas family has to urgently move because with the deregulation of the real estate market, their landlord has just tripled their rent. It's an untenable situation, as the father recently lost his job in the Ministry of Labor, along with more than 35,000 other civil servants.

In the city of Rosario, government minister, Patricia Bullrich, is responsible for implementing a new hardline policy against the drug gangs. We join her to discover how the state is regaining control.

From the vast wilderness of the north of the country, threatened by the acceleration of lithium mining, to the bourgeois neighbourhoods of Buenos Aires, this is an immersion in Javier Milei's ultra-liberal Argentina.





## Planet Killers: Season II

They're the criminal masterminds killing our planet. In this new series of 'Planet Killers', we follow the operations of Interpol's Environmental Crimes Unit as they track down the world's most wanted environmental criminals. Then, they often accused of "fabricating" their abuse claims to gain residency papers. Some are even imprisoned in detention centres and threatened with deportation when they try to press charges.**

In Marseille, in the practice of young Dr. Jeremy Khouani, women seeking asylum come to heal their wounds and tell their stories. Stories in which rape is central, omnipresent. He conducted a ground-breaking study with his patients, published in the prestigious journal 'The Lancet', which

establishes factually what the patients of the Peyssonnel nursing home tell us, like an infernal triptych: the sexual violence that sends them on their way, the violence that marks them out, and the violence that still awaits them when they arrive in Europe.

A film in which the young Marseille doctor's practice is the nerve center, where old and new patients meet. We follow the story of Hira, a young Pakistani woman threatened with deportation and her despair at not being recognized as the victim she is. We also follow Dr Khouani in his mobile consultations with migrants who have just arrived in France, desperate.

This film presents an original approach to the migration issue, focusing on women and the sexual violence to which they are systematically exposed.



## Kumbh Mela: At the Heart of the World's Largest Gathering

Never in the history of humanity will so many people have gathered in one place. Once every 12 years, more than 300 million people are expected for a Hindu pilgrimage of Maha Kumbh Mela. This celebration is held in Prayagraj, in the northeast of India, a city of normally only a million and a half inhabitants which must transform itself to accommodate these hundreds of millions of pilgrims. This film is an immersion in this unique gathering in the world, where snake charmers, multimillionaire gurus, pilgrims and priest mix on the banks of the Ganges.

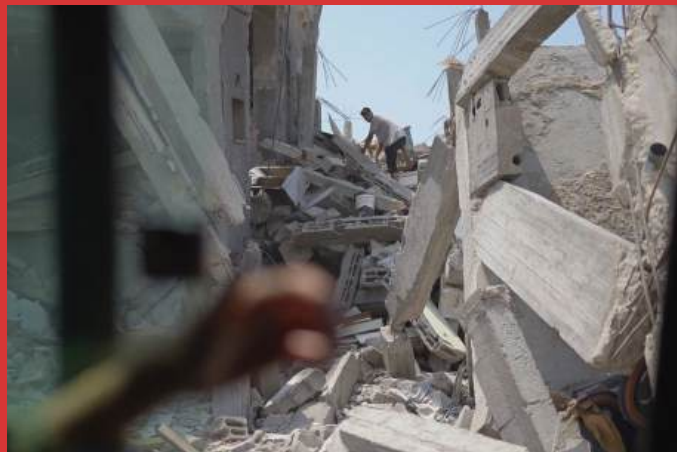

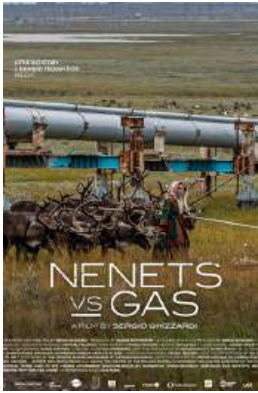

The discovery of massive gas deposits has whetted the appetite of oil corporations like Novatek, TOTAL and the Chinese National Petroleum Corp. But the Yamal peninsula is also the ancestral home of the nenets, who have been pasturing here for over 200 generations. Every year, Vassily and his brigade undertake this 1500 kilometre journey. But for how much longer? Can they survive this industrialisation?

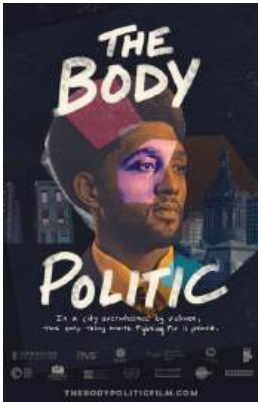

Like many areas in the United States, the City of Baltimore has been plagued by gun violence. Amid the George Floyd uprising, Brandon Scott, a young, black, reform-minded leader, is elected mayor. He grew up here during the city's most troubling years and has lost friends to gun crime. He hopes to lower violence rates with a new more supportive approach. While previous administrations relied on policing and incarceration, Scott stresses the need for prevention and offering alternatives. He wants to give people hope.

With unfettered access, cameras follow him and his team of young leaders throughout their first year in city hall.

## Gaza: Trapped in Hell

Since the start of Operation Iron Sword, provoked by Hamas' attack on Israel, conditions in Gaza have become apocalyptic.

After months of offensive, most of the territory is an uninhabitable field of ruins. 1.5 million people are displaced, forced to constantly relocate by the advancing Israeli army. The Gazans are blocked by the sea to the west, the border with Israel to the north and east, and the border with Egypt to the south. Israel has forbidden all international journalists from accessing the territory but working with 29-year-old Gazan journalist, Shrouq, we recount what is happening.
